If a product label includes language such as:

- “Not approved for human use”
- “For research use only”
- “Experimental”

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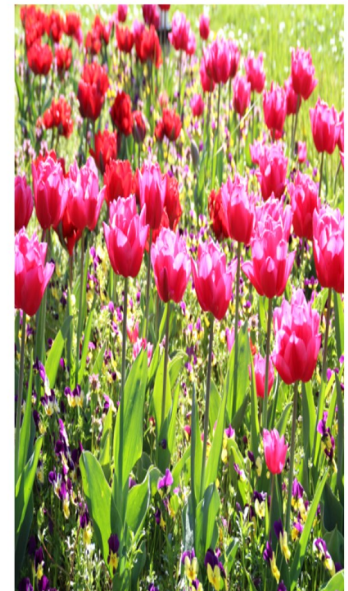
2026-27 Renewal Reminder

If you have already obtained your required chiropractic continuing education hours for the August renewal, please forward a copy of the approved hours now. The hours certificate needs to have the Alabama approval number written on it. The renewal process is much smoother if you don't wait until September to obtain your hours and submit them to the Board. (18 hours are required for your renewal each year with part of those in Alabama Law).

You should have purchased your Alabama Section 136 Business (privilege) License in October for the year 2026-27 please email a copy to Angie.

10/29 and renew by 10/31 with \$100 late fee,

11/24 and renew by 11/30 with \$200 late fee,

12/29 and renew by 12/31 with \$300 late fee

Troy University Appoints Dr. Timothy Stark as Inaugural Director of Doctor of Chiropractic Program



Troy University has named Dr. Timothy Stark as the Inaugural Director of the Doctor of Chiropractic Program within the Troy University College of Health Sciences, the second offered at a public university in the nation.

Dr. Stark steps into the role as the first Chiropractic Director at Troy, leading the development of the new Doctor of Chiropractic program at the university's Dothan campus. His appointment follows final approval of the program and reflects TROY's bold commitment to expanding healthcare education within a public university system.

"The establishment of a Doctor of Chiropractic program within a public university system represents a meaningful and forward-thinking initiative," Dr. Stark shared. "It reflects both confidence in the chiropractic profession and recognition of its expanding role within collaborative healthcare delivery."

Dr. LaGary Carter, Dean of the College of Health Sciences, said Dr. Stark's appointment signals a defining moment for the college and the university.

"Dr. Stark brings a rare combination of global academic leadership, clinical ex-

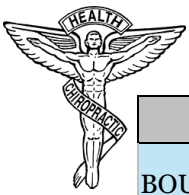
perience, and visionary thinking," Carter said. "As we launch this program, it was essential to find a leader who not only understands the rigor required for accreditation and excellence, but who also embraces innovation and interprofessional collaboration. Dr. Stark embodies those qualities."

Earlier this year, the program reached a significant milestone by receiving approval from the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools Commission on Colleges (SACSCOC). This approval cleared the way for Troy to officially establish the second Doctor of Chiropractic degree offered at a public university, and the first in the southeast.

Carter added that the program aligns seamlessly with TROY's mission.

"Our goal is to prepare healthcare professionals who lead with competence and character. The Doctor of Chiropractic program strengthens our commitment to servant leadership and expands access to high-quality, affordable health sciences education within a public university setting."

PART IV TEST DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE

The National Board of Chiropractic Examiners (NBCE) hosted the Part IV Test Development Committee meeting in Greeley, Colorado on February 20-21, 2026.

The committee of 25 members was composed of State Licensing Board Representatives and faculty from chiropractic colleges across the country. These subject matter experts reviewed and selected content for case management and chiropractic technique which will be utilized for the redeveloped Part IV exam launching this year.

Notice of New AL Law Continuing Education Requirement

The Board has adopted a new rule that will change how licensees obtain the required two (2) hours of continuing education in AL Law each renewal year.

Effective Date: October 1, 2026

Applies To: The 2027–2028 renewal cycle and beyond

Beginning with the 2027–2028 renewal year, **any licensee who actively practices in Alabama** must complete the required two (2) hours of AL Law **in person**.

This requirement **does NOT apply** to licensees who hold an Alabama license but practice exclusively in another state.

Eligible in-person options include:

- Attending a full agenda Board Meeting, or
- Attending an official AL Law presentation conducted by the Board.

Currently, AL Law presentations are offered three (3) times per year at ASCA conventions. The Board is working to expand availability by partnering with additional organizations to host future presentations.

This rule **does not apply** to the 2026–2027 renewal cycle. However, licensees who typically complete continuing education early should begin planning for this change starting October 2026.

190-X-2-.11 Renewal Of License. 2(a)

(2) Continuing Professional Education Required. A minimum of 18 hours of continuing education as approved by the Alabama State Board of Chiropractic Examiners is required annually for license renewal. Annually shall mean October 1 - September 30 of each year.

(a) As a condition of licensure renewal, a chiropractor must obtain every year two (2) hours of continuing education in Board approved courses on chiropractic regulation and compliance with the Alabama Chiropractic Practice Act and Board rules. The two (2) hours are included in the minimum of 18 hours and must be obtained in person by licensees who practice in Alabama, [beginning October 1, 2026](#).

Quick Reminders

- Chiropractic licensees who have received 100+ hours training in Acupuncture from a school or college accredited by the CCE or an ASBCE board approved provider may practice this specialty upon successful passage of an exam given by said school or the National Board of Chiropractic Examiners in Acupuncture.
- Dry Needling may be performed by licensees who have **EITHER** obtained twelve (12) hours live, in-person, hands on study through an ASBCE approved course **OR** possess certification in Acupuncture as defined in Rule 190-X-3-.01.
- **ACT #2025-455** raised the age of consent for medical, dental and mental health services to 16 years and prohibits the withholding of health information from parents/guardians except for situations outlined in §22-8-12(b).

190-X-2-.11 Renewal Of License

Waived or Deferred Educational Requirement Explained

Continuing education (CE) is a crucial renewal requirement, but there are limited circumstances in which these hours may be waived or deferred.

If you cannot complete CE courses due to personal physical illness, disability, military service, or other circumstances beyond your control, you may be eligible to receive a waiver or extension at the Board's discretion.

A formal application must be submitted to the Executive Director and approved by the Board. Written documentation from a physician detailing the diagnosis, prognosis, and the expected duration of inability to practice or attend educational programs must accompany the request. Importantly, waivers related to health conditions are

reserved for situations that prevent active practice for a significant portion of the CE cycle.

Statement of Non-Attendance Waiver (SNAW) applications are available from the Board office. You may submit at any time of the renewal cycle if you have experienced a life-altering event that prohibits or significantly delays your ability to complete the CE requirement.

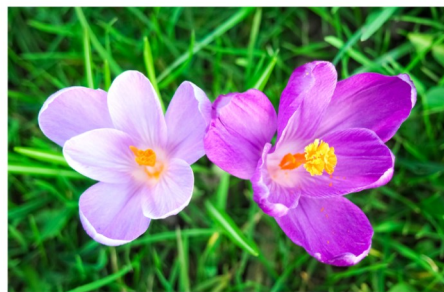
